LEWCO and LogistiQ announced plans for a \$24M expansion that will create approximately 208 new jobs in the region.

SANDUSKY BAY PATHWAY

There is an open Request For Qualifications (RFQ) for a consultant team on an ATIIP-funded planning project due end of January, focusing on multi-use trail connections between Sandusky and Port Clinton—with special emphasis on feasibility for a pedestrian/bike pathway across Sandusky Bay, building on the recent federal Active Transportation Infrastructure Investment Program grant.

ROUTE 6 COORIDOR STUDY

The Erie County Port Authority is leading the effort for a Route 6 Corridor Economic Development Study to examine economic opportunities along Rt. 6 from Rye Beach Road to Cedar Point Drive. GSP has engaged key stakeholders to identify priorities, and we're actively seeking additional funders to launch the study in Q2 2026.



These initiatives advance regional connectivity and vibrancy—extending the visionary 100-mile Sandusky Bay Pathway network while unlocking economic potential along critical corridors like Rt. 6.





CITY OF SANDUSKY

Sandusky, Ohio -- The City of Sandusky invites you to take part in an [online survey](#) as the next step in the [Housing Development Accelerator](#), a citywide effort focused on expanding housing options and strengthening neighborhoods.

The survey follows a series of in-person focus group workshops held this fall and gives residents another opportunity to share feedback on housing needs, preferences, and development standards across the city. Additional follow-up discussions are planned for March.

The online survey will be open from December 22, 2025, through January 30, 2026, and is open to all residents, workers, property owners, and others with an interest in Sandusky's future.

"This is a chance for people to weigh in on the types of housing they want to see in Sandusky and how new development should fit into existing neighborhoods," said Chief Planner Arin Blair. "The feedback we receive will directly inform future planning, design guidance, and zoning updates."

The Housing Development Accelerator is led by the City's Division of Planning in partnership with OHM Advisors. The project is focused on identifying practical, market-ready housing types that align with neighborhood character and support the City's long-term housing goals outlined in its Strategic Plan.







Partner with Us to Strengthen Business and Child Care Together

My Faith Learning Center is partnering with local employers to create a sustainable solution that benefits both businesses and families. Through a state funded Business Partnership Grant, businesses can:

- Reserve guaranteed child care slots for their employees
- Contribute directly to child care tuition support
(additional discounts with the preferred employer plan)

This partnership aligns business needs with dependable, high-quality child care for working families. By joining us, your organization helps build a stronger workforce, supports employee well-being, and invests in the long-term growth of our community.

We invite your business to be part of this collaboration and help shape a model that works for employers, employees, and children alike. Each business partner will be encouraged to participate in the first year of the project to receive foundational support that will help them implement the needed plan for long-term employee support implementation through their fiscal and human resource infrastructure. Support from the state grant will be provided in tiers: 75% in the first year, 25% in the second year, and phased out entirely by the third year, at which point no state support will be provided. The grant will provide support and a "runway" for businesses to update HR policies, rework fiscal investments and support new and existing employees with their child care needs. Child care supports offer a meaningful benefit that reduces absenteeism and improves retention for any business that invests.

To partner and take advantage of this grant opportunity you will:

1. Sign a MOU between the child care program and business
2. CCRC will assist the business with creating a rollout or pilot run of the program
3. Data will be collected from both the child care program and partnering business
4. Quarterly meetings will be held with the child care staff, HR staff and if there are parent groups we will meet with them as well.
