More Than A Trail Investing in our Greatest Shared Asset

This week, our community celebrates an important milestone with the opening of another critical section of the Sandusky Bay Pathway, creating a new connection between the Cedar Point Causeway and the Cedar Point Sports Center.

Congratulations to the City of Sandusky and the many partners, planners, engineers, elected officials, and community advocates whose long-term commitment made this project possible. Projects like this take years of vision, persistence, and collaboration, and everyone involved should be proud of this accomplishment.

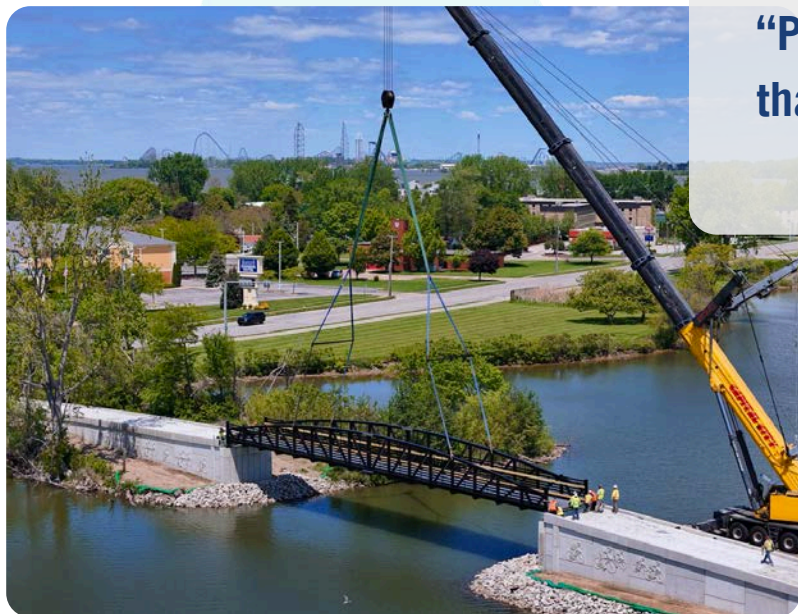
While this ribbon cutting marks the completion of an important segment, it also reminds us of something much bigger. The Sandusky Bay Pathway represents an opportunity to rethink how we connect people to the defining natural asset of our region: *Lake Erie*.

Communities that embrace their waterfronts consistently become stronger places to live, visit, and invest. Public access to the water is more than a recreational amenity—it is a quality-of-life investment that supports healthier residents, attracts talent, encourages private investment, strengthens tourism, and creates vibrant public spaces where communities come together.

That is especially true here. We are a freshwater coastal community, and Lake Erie shapes our economy, our recreation, our history, and our future.

The vision for the Sandusky Bay Pathway extends well beyond this newest segment. Erie County is leading plans to connect Huron and Vermilion. The City of Huron continues expanding its municipal trail network. Later this year, the City of Port Clinton and Greater Sandusky Partnership will begin a federally funded planning effort to explore connections between Erie and Ottawa counties, including the exciting possibility of restoring the historic Bay Bridge as a pedestrian and bicycle crossing. That grant was one of only fourteen awarded nationwide in its funding round, reflecting the significance of reconnecting communities around Sandusky Bay.

Together, these projects improve safety, expand recreation, support local businesses, and strengthen the connections between the communities that share our shoreline. They also position us to pursue a long-term vision of extending the pathway east toward Vermilion and west toward Elmore, creating one of the Great Lakes' premier waterfront trail systems.

This work reflects a broader trend. *[A report from the Brookings Institution](#)* highlights that Midwestern communities making intentional investments in quality of life, public spaces, and placemaking are increasingly outperforming their peers. Today, those investments are not simply community amenities—they are essential economic development strategies.

As Greater Sandusky Partnership begins its integration with Shores & Islands Ohio, we have an opportunity to think even more comprehensively about the role Lake Erie plays in our future. For years, Shores & Islands has invited residents and visitors alike to experience **Lake Erie Love**. Projects like the Sandusky Bay Pathway—and investments in public access across our region—are what bring that idea to life. People develop a deeper appreciation for Lake Erie when they can see it, touch it, paddle on it, fish from it, walk alongside it, or simply make it part of their everyday lives or a memorable vacation.

Tourism, economic development, talent attraction, and community development all intersect at the waterfront. The more accessible, connected, and welcoming our shoreline becomes, the stronger our region becomes as a place where people want to live, build businesses, invest, and visit.

The Sandusky Bay Pathway is more than a trail. It is an investment in health, connectivity, economic opportunity, and the future of our freshwater coast. Each new connection brings us one step closer to realizing the full potential of Lake Erie as our region's greatest shared asset.



Progress Continues for Regional Partnership

The planned integration of Shores & Islands Ohio and the Greater Sandusky Partnership continues to move forward.

In June, the Erie County Visitors and Convention Bureau Board (ECVCB) approved a management agreement with the Greater Sandusky Partnership. The agreement establishes a framework for the Greater Sandusky Partnership to manage destination marketing activities on behalf of the ECVCB while preserving local oversight through the visitor bureau.

The Greater Sandusky Partnership has also launched a search for a Chief Marketing Officer who will lead marketing, communications, and place-branding initiatives as the organizations continue their integration. The position will help align strategies that support visitor attraction, talent attraction, and business investment throughout the region. [View Job Opportunity Here.](#)

Projects Considered & Approved

3 projects were approved by the Erie County Port Authority board last month. Total Investment for the three approved projects is \$229.8 million. The Sandusky Senior lofts, a multifamily housing development in the city of Sandusky will offer affordable housing for seniors. Congrats and thank you to the City of Sandusky for leading this transformational project.

PORT PROJECTS YTD

2026 Project Progress

YTD 2026, three projects have closed, generating nearly \$18.9 million in capital investment, creating more than 50 new jobs, retaining 90 existing positions, and delivering significant savings for local businesses and partner communities. An additional 16 projects remain in the pipeline, representing more than \$533 million in potential capital investment, over \$4.7 million in direct company savings, and the retention of more than 400 jobs.

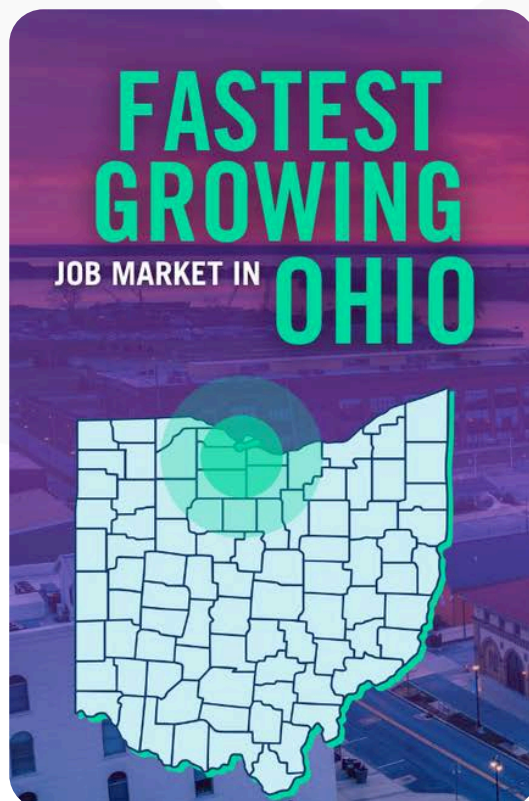

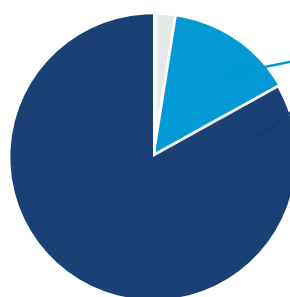

Construction continues to move forward on the City of Sandusky's new Recreation Center at the corner of Rockwell Street and Hayes Avenue at the old American Crayon site. Recent progress includes installation of concrete block walls for the gymnasium and the Pre-Engineered Metal Building frame for the gymnasium has been completely erected. Next, the contractors will start to install the insulated metal roofing for the gymnasium.

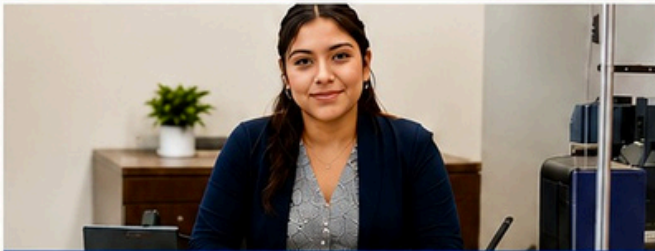
